In last month's Newsletter I reflected with memories of Christmas from my childhood—and specifically memories of how our family shared with great joy the birth of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ. Linda and I are of

the age where we are frequently saddened by some of the Christmas letter we receive, or do not receive, in response to our Christmas letters: My high school buddy now has severe dementia; One of my former Department Chairs who just last year was attending the Adult Day Care in our Community Center is now in a full-time care facility; Another former Department Chair had a stroke during the past year and is now hospitalized with pneumonia; and there was no letter from a faculty colleague who has been in a long-term care facility for several years—what does no letter received this year mean in this case? Then this week Linda received an email from a close friend who detailed the last months and days of her husband of 56 years, which brought both of us to tears. But later in the email her friend also gave us comfort by saying how thankful she was that her husband was now with his Lord and Savior Jesus Christ. We will soon be in the Lenten season, which prepares us to reflect on the suffering and death of Jesus on the cross for our sins, but then we will rejoice in His resurrection on Easter morning. Thus, we have comfort and confidence that when we leave this life on Earth, we too will be with our Lord and Savior forever with no more pain and suffering.

As our new officer and Directors for 2020 are installed this Sunday, we thank all who have served during 2019, and encourage members to agree to fill some vacancies. As we consider the 2020 budget at the Voters meeting on Sunday, we thank all members and attendees (and some anonymous person for a gift of \$9,000) for their gifts to our church, which have contributed to a financial turn-around for our church. In addition to receipts from a full 12 months of usage of our Community Center for the Adult Day Care program, receipts from seven months of sharing our sanctuary and fellowship room with the Korean Church have certainly been a blessing. The final approval of the Verizon cell tower in December also assures us of their continued support in future years. Progress is being made in starting the English as a Second Language classes with the grant funds received the Lutheran Women's Missionary League. The big uncertainty in the budget is when will Pastor Harbaugh begin his service as an Air Force Reserve Chaplain.



GRILLED CHEESE & TOMATO SOUP BAKE

This is similar to a savory french toast casserole and combines two favorite dishesgrilled cheese with tomato soup.

TOTAL TIME: Prep: 25 min. Bake: 25 min. + standing YIELD: 6 servings.





INGREDIENTS:

3 ounces reduced-fat cream cheese
12 slices Italian, sourdough or rye bread (1/2 inch thick)
6 tablespoons butter, softened
1 garlic clove, minced
1/4 teaspoon pepper
2 large eggs

1-1/2 teaspoons dried basil, divided 6 slices part-skim mozzarella cheese 1/2 cup tomato paste 1/4 teaspoon salt 1-3/4 cups 2% milk 1 cup shredded Italian cheese blend

DIRECTIONS:

1. Preheat oven to 350°. In a small bowl, mix cream cheese and 1 teaspoon basil until blended; spread onto 6 bread slices. Top with mozzarella cheese and remaining bread. Spread outsides of sandwiches with butter. Arrange in a greased 13x9-in. baking dish. 2. In a small saucepan, combine tomato paste, garlic, salt, pepper and remaining basil; cook and stir over medium heat 1 minute. Gradually whisk in milk; bring to a boil. Reduce heat; simmer, uncovered, 4-5 minutes or until thickened, stirring frequently. Remove from heat. 3. Whisk eggs in a large bowl; gradually whisk in a third of the milk mixture. Stir in remaining milk mixture; pour over sandwiches. Sprinkle with Italian cheese blend. 4. Bake, uncovered, 25-30 minutes or until golden brown and cheese is melted. Let stand 10 minutes before serving.
